ETHEL's character has the potential to draw for a talented pool of mature actresses Some preliminary casting ideas include the following:



#### CHRISTOPHER (23)

Tall, broad shouldered, handsome ex-public-school crack head.

Wears inexpensive trendy clothes.

He recently drifted into Class A drugs after meeting Shaney, a harsh substitute for his mother, who carries on teaching him rejection.







## SHAMEY (22)

Shaney thrives on control. She possesses a cruel destructive attitude and doesn't care whom she hurts. She sells drugs, a full medicine cabinet of anything you need and makes a good living from it. Her eyes are coated in heavy black makeup. She wears vintage punk with a lot of holes and see-through netting, fingerless gloves and combat boots. She has a short fuse when things don't go her way. Streetwise, foul mouthed, a product of multiple foster homes and sexual abuse.











#### ~ DRIVEN

I'm an international filmmaker passionate about stories and people that spark change. I weave stories that stem from the horrors of organ trafficking to the possibilities of VR travel, to how technology shapes our identities, a captivating balance of real-life inspiration and straight up entertainment. We're all meaning-making-machines on this grand stage of life, and my films aim to reflect that.

#### ~ STORYTELLER

## DIRECTOR'S VISION

INT. OLD CAFE - LONDON - NIGHT

The director sets the script down and scribbles excitedly:

Alright! This London based script is pure fire. It's an American woman's love song to London. Raw, honest, authentic and - as we say somewhere on earth, it's gonna punch you right in the feels.

This story takes aim at one of those sterile, soulless nursing homes — I call'em « Houses of Silence."

We've all seen it, the vacant stares, the listless shuffling. It's a tragedy, plain and simple.

But what if it didn't have to be that way? Barbara throws a wrecking ball at that whole system. Her 'Ethel's a firecracker, a blast from the 60s trapped in her golden years.

This film is about reclaiming life after 70. A sort of Coming of... a certain age story.

Ethel shows us that nursing homes can be universities of experience, not just waiting rooms to the beyond.

A transcultural screenwriter myself gives me a unique perspective on London. It allows me to see the city anew and explore aspects that might seem obvious to someone who grew up here. This outsider's POV is what I want to bring to this film:
to capture this story through Ethel's eyes — a vibrant
21st-century British soul trapped in a groovy 60s aesthetic
but with cell phones.

Think THE LADY IN THE VAN (UK-2015) meets LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE (US-2006).

This isn't nostalgia. It's a call to action.

We'll delve into the real issues facing our elders —

isolation, loneliness, a lack of purpose.

But we won't wallow in it

We'll show how Ethel, in her own crazy, wonderful way, brings connection back to one specific "House of Silence.

Imagine residents sharing skills, mentoring each other, rediscovering their passions. We'll create a vibrant tapestry of life, a universal testament to the power of human connection at any age. This film won't just entertain; it'll spark conversations. It'll make people question the way we treat our elders. It might even inspire a reunion or two.

That's the power of good storytelling.

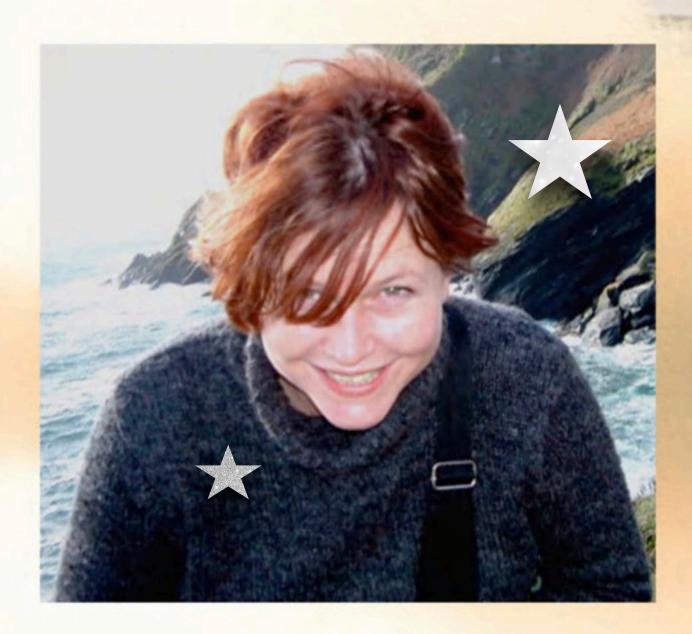

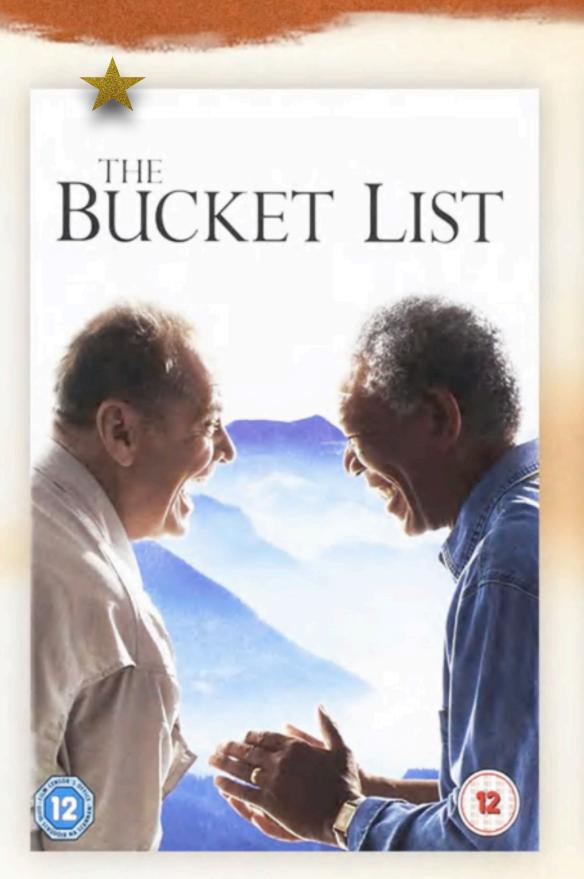

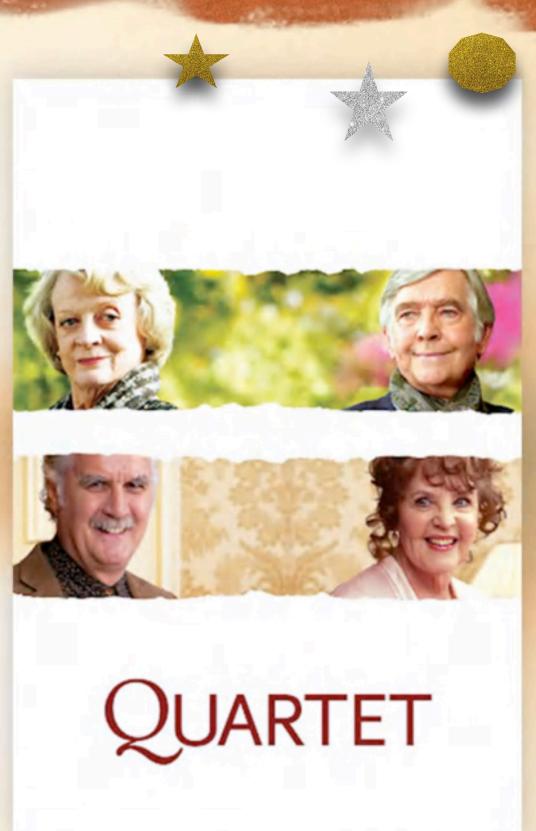
